

# **Goat Department**

## **Specific Department Rules**

1. All General, Livestock and Department rules as well as Health Regulations apply.
2. The goat judging will be on Monday following the conclusion of the Sheep show.
3. All goat entries shall be accompanied by an entry fee of \$3.00 per head.
4. Scrapie regulations require all goats to have individual identification numbers or recognizable tattoo.
5. Goats do not require a health certificate, but are subject to a health inspection. See General Livestock Rules and Health Requirements printed in this catalog.
6. All recognized breeds of goats are eligible to compete in the breeding classes by breed or as crossbred.
7. Market classes are open to market goats of either sex (doe or wether). Males must be castrated and show no rupture or unhealed cut.
8. Market goats must have their baby teeth.

# **Sheep Department**

## **Specific Department Rules**

1. All General, Livestock and Department rules as well as Health Regulations apply.
2. The Sheep show will be held Monday at 10:30 a.m.
3. All entries shall be accompanied by a \$3.00 entry fee.
4. Sheep do not require a health certificate, but are subject to a health inspection. See General Livestock Rules and Health Requirements printed in this catalog.
5. Animals showing symptoms of disease, particularly foot rot, wool fungus, sore mouth, sheep pox, or scrapie will not be allowed to show and must be removed from the fairgrounds.
6. All recognized breeds of Sheep are eligible to compete in the breeding classes by breed or as crossbred.
7. All breeding sheep must be registered in their respective breed association and wear a private flock eartag, number, or tattoo.
8. Crossbred and purebred sheep without registration papers will be shown in a commercial classes with two divisions , meat and wool classes.
9. Market classes are open to market lambs of either sex (ewe or wether). Males must be castrated and show no rupture or unhealed cut.
10. Market Lambs must have their baby teeth.

# **Swine Department**

## **Specific Department Rules**

1. All General, Livestock and Department rules as well as Health Regulations apply.
2. The Swine show will be held Tuesday at 5:00 p.m.
3. All entries shall be accompanied by a \$3.00 entry fee.
4. All swine will be requires to have health certificates. See General Livestock Rules and Health Requirements printed in this catalog.
5. Animals showing symptoms of any contagious infectious or communicable disease, particularly erysipelas, or atrophic rhinitis will not be allowed to show and must be removed from the fairgrounds.
6. Market Classes are open to hogs of either sex (gilts or barrows). Males must be castrated and show no rupture or unhealed cut.
7. All breeding swine must be registered in their respective association and identified by eartotch, eartag, or tattoo.

# **Beef Cattle Department**

## **Specific Department Rules**

1. All General, Livestock and Department rules as well as Health Regulations apply.
2. Beef Cattle show will be immediately following the conclusion of the Dairy Cattle show, which begins at 5:00 p.m. Wednesday.
3. All beef cattle entries shall be accompanied by a \$3.50 entry fee.
4. Any animal showing symptoms of infectious or contagious disease, including active lesions of ringworm or multiple warts easily visible without close examination will not be allowed to show and must be removed from the fairgrounds.
5. No non-registered bulls will be eligible to show.
6. Market classes are open to steers only.
7. Market steers must have all baby teeth.
8. The Open Show – Pen of Three Steers must have tags in the ear upon entering the fairgrounds.
9. If a Pen of Three Steers is entered a Junior(s) exhibitor of the family has the option to show one of the three steers in the Market Steer Show and must be entered as such.

## **County Bred Heifer Rules**

1. All entries are subject to General, Livestock and Beef Department rules.
  2. All entries in the County Bred Heifer Show must be pre-registered on the official Greene County Fair Entry Form and postmarked or dropped at the fairgrounds by entry deadline for all other entries.
  3. CBHS is Limited to JUNIOR exhibitors ONLY.
  4. Open to all recognized breeds and commercial heifers. All breeds and commercial heifers will show together in the CBHS.
  5. Heifers purchased or raised by exhibitors must be certified as being Bred and Raised in Greene County.
- All prize monies and awards for CBHS are provided by the Greene County Cattlemen's Association.

# **Equine Department**

## **Specific Department Rules**

1. All General, Livestock and Department rules as well as Health Regulations apply.
2. All equine judging will be held in the Livestock Arena on Thursday at 5:00 p.m.
3. All ponies and miniature horse entries shall be accompanied by a \$3.50 entry fee, and all other equine entries (mules, draft horses, and horses) shall be accompanied by a \$3.00 entry fee.
4. All Equine will be required to have proof of a negative Coggins within the last 12 months. Any animal not having a current Coggins test will not be allowed to show and must be removed from the fairgrounds. Also see General Livestock Rules and Health Requirements printed in this catalog.
5. All Ponies, Miniature Horses, Mules, Draft Horses, and Horses will be shown in halter.
6. All equine entered in their respective shows must be from Greene County.
7. All Ponies and Miniature Horses must be stalled on the fairgrounds during the entire fair.
8. ONLY WOOD SHAVINGS will be allowed as bedding in horse stalls.
9. All Shetland Ponies entered must be 46" or under in height, and Welch Ponies must be 46" to 54" in height.
10. No Stallions, over one year of age, of any type are allowed on the fairgrounds.
11. All equine classes are open shows, meaning they are open to adults and juniors, with the exception of the showmanship classes which are only open to juniors.

# **Poultry Department**

## **Specific Department Rules**

1. All General, Livestock and Department rules as well as Health Regulations apply.
  2. All poultry entries shall be accompanied by a \$1.00 entry fee.
  3. Exhibitors will be responsible for feeding and watering their own poultry,
  4. All poultry exhibited in Arkansas shall have originated from U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid clean flocks or have had a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within 90 days of the movement to the exhibition. **State Regulation**: All poultry must be tested before entering the fairgrounds. **There will be a \$0.50 per bird charge for the poultry testing.** Also see General Livestock Rules and Health Requirements printed in this catalog.
  5. All poultry must appear free of disease, open wounds and/or sores
  6. No more than three birds will be placed in one cage.
  7. All classes are open to adults (Open) and juniors.
  8. All entries have to be a recognized pure bred bird.
  9. Only large type chickens and bantams will be accepted. (**NO DUCKS OR GAME CHICKENS MAY BE ENTERED**)
  10. All poultry will be shown in a class with its own breed.
  11. All exhibitors are limited to six (6) pens each.
  12. No exhibitor may have more than three (3) pens of any one breed.
- Poultry will be tested on August 21 from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. in the Livestock Barn.
  - NO Poultry will be tested at the fair.

# **Rabbit Department**

4. All animals must be free disease, ear mites, open wounds, and sores.
5. No more than two animals will be placed in one cage.
6. All classes are open to adults (Open) and juniors.
7. All rabbits will be shown in a class with its own breed. There will be a mixed breed class.

# **Youth Broiler Show**

## **Specific Department Rules**

1. All General, Livestock and Department rules as well as Health Regulations apply.
2. The Broiler Show will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday.
3. Chicks must be ordered through the County Extension Service or local Agriculture Instructor/FFA Chapter, from the University of Arkansas, Poultry Science Department.
4. 30 chicks will be provided to each exhibitor at the cost of \$15.00.
5. The broiler show is open to all Greene County youth ages 5 to 19 years of age, and must be an active member of a 4-H Club or FFA Chapter.
6. All birds will be from a single hatch from the same breeder flock and will be wing banded for permanent identification by the University of Arkansas Poultry Science Department.
7. Participants will be responsible for acquiring feed for the project and caring for the birds.
8. A pen of three (3) 6-7 week old broilers pullets constitutes one entry for the fair.
9. Broiler entries will need to arrive at the Livestock Show Arena one (1) hour before the show for sifting.
10. Participants need to bring 2 or 3 alternates in addition to their 3 largest broilers to use in case of their top 3 doesn't make it through the sift.
11. The broilers will be released immediately after the show.
12. One broiler from the Grand Champion Pen and broiler from the Reserve Champion Pen must return to the Livestock Show Arena on Saturday, thirty minutes prior to the Premium Sale that will begin at 5:30.
13. The broiler projects will not be subject to testing for U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid.

6. All registered breeds and grade breeds of dairy cattle are eligible to show.
